
Reed, Gaylon Earl | 1919-2011 Published Thursday, March 3, 2011



Funeral for Gaylon Earl Reed, 91, of Decatur is 2 p.m.

Thursday, March 3, at Cornerstone Baptist Church in Decatur with the Rev. Alvis Edmondson officiating. Burial will follow at Oaklawn Cemetery. Visitation was to be 6 to 8 p.m. Wednesday at Coker-Hawkins Funeral Home in Decatur.

Reed died Monday, Feb. 28, 2011, in Weatherford.

Born Aug. 28, 1919, in Lometa to Gene and Beulah Reed, he was a building contractor. He enlisted in the U.S. Air Force after high school, and during his seven years of service, he attained the rank of master sergeant of the 20th bomber command stationed on Tinian Island in India. As a flight engineer, he traveled over the Alps during World War II on a B-29 bomber.

Upon returning from the war, he married Sue Burton Jan. 22, 1946. He golfed, fished and hunted.

He was preceded in death by two brothers and three sisters.
