
Shoop, Glenn Powell | 1921-2011 *Published Sunday, May 1, 2011*



Graveside service for Glenn Powell Shoop, 90, of Dallas was April 29 at Hillcrest Memorial Park with Robert Jeffress of First Baptist Church of Dallas officiating.

Shoop died Sunday, April 24, 2011, in Dallas.

Born Sept. 1, 1920, in Gracemont, Okla., to Roy A. and Myrtle Goodfellow Shoop, he was a pilot for the U.S. Army Air Corps in World War II and a captain for Braniff International Airlines for 34 years until he retired from flying in 1980.

He graduated from Gracemont High School in 1938 and attended the University of Oklahoma in Norman from 1938 to 1942, leaving one semester short of a degree to join the corps where he was commissioned in 1943 as a first lieutenant, based with the Air Transport Command at Love Field. In 2006, the University of Oklahoma recognized his accomplishments with the OU Regents' Award.

He was a deacon, junior high boys Sunday school teacher and chapel choir sponsor at First Baptist Church of Dallas where he met his wife, Louise Vollmer Shoop. They were married March 19, 1943, in Dallas.

He was a rancher and farmer who served on the board of the Justin State Bank. Shoop was preceded in death by his wife.

He is survived by sister Joyce Shoop Jones of Illinois; children Merilou Shoop Love of South Padre Island, Paul Shoop and wife, Lee, of Malibu, Calif., and Nancy Shoop Jeffery and husband, Estel, of Little Rock, Ark.; grandchildren Aaron Shoop, Tyler Shoop, Preston Love and wife, Shannon, Luke Love and wife, Jill, Jordan Caver, Tristan Caver, Taylor Shoop, Evan Shoop, Madison Shoop and Logan Shoop; greatgrandchildren David Roberts, Audrey Love, Noah Roberts and Jillian Love.
