Lee "Pete" Reeves, Jr, 78, died Tuesday, June 4, 2013, in Decatur.

Funeral was Friday, June 7 at the First Baptist Church of Decatur with Reverend Ken May officiating. Interment was in Oaklawn Cemetery under the direction of Coker-Hawkins Funeral Home.

He played football, basketball and track and he set a new record in high jump in 1952 at Austin.

He married Peggy Hubbard Oct. 4, 1952, in Ardmore, Okla. and the couple reaffirmed their vows on Oct. 4, 1982. Pete retired from the engineering department of the TXDOT after 40 years of service. He was a licensed engineer tech, inspector and project manager. After his retirement, Pete enjoyed hunting and traveling with Peggy.

Pete was a member of the First Baptist Church for the past 53 years, treasurer of this Sunday School class and was an usher and greeter for the last 20 years.
