Thomas Marvin Robinson, 44, of Altus, Okla., died Saturday, March 9, 2013.

Funeral is 2 p.m. Wednesday, March 13, at Lowell-Tims Chapel in Altus with the Rev. Donald Hervey officiating. Burial will follow at Altus City Cemetery under the direction of Lowell-Tims Funeral Home. Thomas was born March 29, 1968, in Fort Worth to Tom C. and Allene Robinson. He graduated from Bridgeport High School in 1986 and married Michelle McBride at Carswell Air Force Base in Fort Worth July 30, 1988.

Thomas served as a firefighter for the U.S. Air Force from 1992 to 1996 at Altus Air Force Base. After that, he was in the Air National Guard for a year-and-a-half at Lambert-St. Louis International Airport in Missouri before returning to Altus AFB as a Department of Defense civilian firefighter in 1998. He transferred to Fort Knox, Ky., in 2009 for two years before again returning to Altus in 2011. In August 2012, he retired with a medical disability.

He was a loving husband, a wonderful father and the greatest PaPa to his granddaughter. His No. 1 priority was his family, and if you were lucky enough to be his friend, you had a loyal friend for a lifetime.
