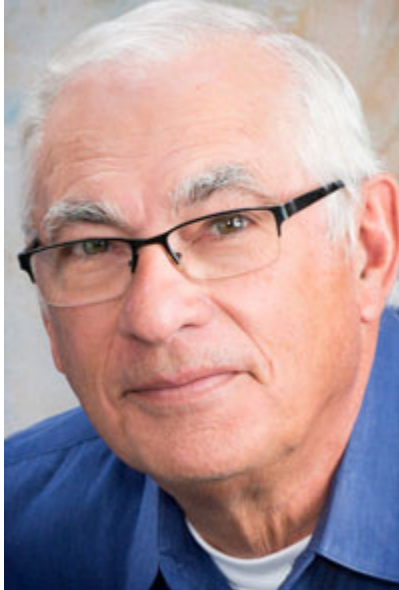


Clyde Edward Spain | 1946-2016
