July 6 — Nicholas Chance Rhodes, 17 of Boyd was killed in a head-on collision on Farm Road 2123, just east of Cottondale. Rhodes was driving eastbound in a Toyota Tundra about 4 p.m. when he crossed into the west-bound lane of traffic, colliding head-on with a Ford pickup. The driver of the Ford was extricated from his vehicle by first responders and flown to John Peter Smith Hospital in Fort Worth with serious injuries. Rhodes was a Paradise High School student.

Nicholas Chance Rhodes, 17, of Boyd, died Thursday, July 6, 2017, in Cottondale.

Funeral is 11 a.m. Tuesday, July 11 at First Baptist Church in Boyd with Brothers Terry Terry, Charles Pugh, J.D. Weido and Jacob Luman officiating. Burial will follow at Boyd Cemetery.

Family will receive friends 6 to 8 p.m. Monday at the First Baptist Church in Boyd.

Hawkins Funeral Home in Boyd is handling arrangements.

Nicholas was born Jan. 24, 2000, in Fort Worth to Mark and Katy (Kemper) Rhodes. He played football and was a powerlifter at Paradise High School. Nicholas was a member of Friendship Baptist Church. He loved fishing and hunting.

He was preceded in death by his mother; and grandfathers Sonny Rhodes and Robert Kemper.
