Charles McMillan Todd, 82, joined the Lord on Friday, Aug. 28, 2020.

Charles was born Mary 15, 1938, in Red Springs, N.C., to R.B. and Alma Todd. He graduated from Elon University in North Carolina with a degree in accounting. He quickly realized long hours at a desk deprived him of rich personal interactions and began his lifetime craft as a salesman.

He moved to Runaway Bay in 1992 and married Yvonne Pratt July 9, 1994. He retired from the household chemical division at Sara Lee Corporation after 25 years, being the only employee to receive the president's award twice. He traded his Sara Lee suit for a Runaway Bay branded golf shirt, becoming an active member of the Runaway Bay Community Church, RB Golf Club and Resort, and Runaway Bay's most ardent salesman.

As a member of the community, he served as the president of the homeowners' association, president of the Bridgeport Lion's Club, founder of 4th Fest and an active member of the men's golf association.

Charles continued his lifelong philosophy of giving by donating his body to the UT Southwestern Medical Center, so that others may benefit.

His memory will continue to live through those he touched, especially his wife, Yvonne Todd; his daughter, Sandie Albritton and husband, Tim; daughter Lisa Cromwell and husband, Bruce; son Tracer Pratt and his wife, Tracie; son Randy Pratt; grandchildren Erika, Jessica, Beau, Jacob, Lauren, Jackson and Lexxy; great-grandchildren Wesley and Piper; his brother, Robert Todd; and many extended family members in North Carolina, as well as a host of spirited friends. The Runaway Bay Golf Club will host a memorial service at 6 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 3, to celebrate his life.
