In a winding conversation On Jan. 25, Lt. Tommy Gow- that shifted fluidly between tears and hearty laughter, the was not only a fellow firefighter but one of Allen's close friends.

"He loved to fight fire," Allen said. "I would drive and he would be on the back of the brush truck and we would tear it up. That's one thing I'm going to miss. I'm going to miss my right hand man.'
