

Whitmire, James Edward 'Jim' 1943-2023

James worked with Tandy Leather Company for 34 years, retiring as president of the company in 1996. He later worked with his daughter for 10 years at Centre for Neuro Skills in Irving. He loved spending time on his small hobby farm and was a voracious reader who enjoyed his library, treasured his books and watched "A Christmas Carol" year round. He adored his family and could always find an opportunity to make a long story longer.

James was born in Houston, Oct. 4, 1943, and his younger years were spent in Cold Springs before moving to Wise County, where he attended school and worked as a cowboy on a 3,000-acre cattle ranch. Here, he learned leathercraft and enjoyed making gifts and items to sell before eventually going to work

for Tandy.

James is survived by his wife of 60 years, Mildred Rudd Whitmire. The childhood sweethearts met in sixth grade in Slidell, and went on to be two of the eleven in their graduating class. They married in 1962 and spent every day since then taking care of each other.
