ENNIS: Maggie Green Cook, 87, died on Wednesday, August 25, 2010.

She was born in the family farmhouse on November 1, 1922, in Bridgeport, Texas; a daughter of the late James Monroe and Annie Harriet Elizabeth Carpenter Green.

She taught her family, especially the girls, all the practical life skills needed to raise a family.

Maggie was preceded in death by her husband, Walter E. Cook; her parents, James and Annie Green; two brothers, James, Jr. (Jeat) and Sam Green; and four sisters, Catherine Green Cook, Annie Pearl Green Lusk, Maxine Green Ordway, and Nellie Jo Green.
