Greg Quebe, 60, of Decatur died Saturday, Sept. 5, 2015, in Denton. He fought a yearlong battle with cancer. Funeral is 2 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 9, at the First Baptist Church in Taylor with burial at Taylor City Cemetery. Pallbearers are Matt Teichelman; Russell, Spencer and Merl Pryor; and Jack and Jason Seals. Coaches and football players from the Class of 1973 are honorary pallbearers.

Greg was born Dec. 1, 1954, in Taylor to Joe S. Quebe and Joyce (Drawe) Quebe. He attended Taylor Public Schools, graduating in 1973. During his sixth grade year, he lived in Austin with his sister, Jeanie, and her husband, Doug Clark, and served as a Senate page during the term of Gov. John Connally. Greg played football and was a three-year letterman for the Taylor Ducks. His senior year he was all-district offensive guard and Super Centex. He attended Texas A&M University where he loved all the great traditions there.

Greg married Vickie Snider June 14, 1975, at First Baptist Church in Decatur. They lived in College Station until 1978 and moved back to Taylor where he worked for Quebe Construction Co. Greg had other careers in law enforcement and sales. In 1999, he and Vickie moved to Decatur, where they lived on the land that has been in her family since 1899. Greg's hobbies were hunting, fishing and camping. He loved his grandchildren and enjoyed giving them rides on the golf cart when they would visit. Charlie Brown and Buster Brown were his Yorkies, and they were at his head and side when he sat in his recliner.

Greg was preceded in death by his son, Jeremy Quebe; his mother, Joyce Drawe Quebe; and sister Jean Quebe Clark. He's survived by his wife of 40 years, Vickie Snider Quebe; father Joe Quebe of Decatur; sons Joey and wife, Amy, of Taylor and Nathan and wife, Holli; grandchildren Cameron, Will, Bella and Tori; sister Nancy Seals and husband, Jack; father- and mother-in-law Billy Joe and Lawana Snider; sister-in-laws Terrie Pryor and husband, Merl, and Teresa Snider; and nieces and nephews Matt Teichelman, Russell and Spencer Pryor and Jessica and Jason Seals.
