Waymon David Williams, 72, of Decatur died Wednesday, Dec. 21, 2016. He died from complications of Alzheimer's. Memorial service is 11 a.m. Tuesday, Dec. 27, at The River Church in Decatur. Visitation is 6 to 8 p.m. Monday, Dec. 26, at Hawkins Funeral Home in Decatur.

Waymon was born March 18, 1944, in San Angelo to John D. and Ethel Williams. He enjoyed a rich childhood in Wickett with cherished friends and beloved cousins. He attended the First Baptist Church there and often led the song service. Waymon graduated from Monahans High School, where he sang in a barber shop quartet and played in the band.

He received a Master's in Business Administration from the University of North Texas in accounting and became a certified public accountant and real estate developer, building restaurants for Steak and Ale, Chi Chi's and Outback Steakhouse. His career led him and his family to Dallas, Tyler, Round Rock, Louisville, Ky., Norman, Okla., and back to Texas.

Waymon enjoyed family trips fishing, camping and hunting. He also enjoyed spending time with his family at home, family reunions and making and keeping friends. He served as a deacon in the early days of Prestonwood Baptist Church in Dallas, and he spent his life wanting to lead others to Jesus. Waymon and Judy had attended The River Church since moving to Decatur in 2004. After an illness, he lived at Senior Care in Decatur, under the care of many loving medical professionals.

Waymon was preceded in death by his parents; and brother Dwain. He is survived by his wife, Judy, of 51 years; son Kenneth Williams of Redding, Calif.; daughter-in-law Tiffany; daughter Tina Clark of Frisco; son-in-law Matt; grandchildren Garrett, Austin, Hudson, Macey, Cooper, Knox and Sutton; and other family and friends.
