Col. Leon Jay Givler, 86, of Jacksboro, died Wednesday, May 3, 2017, in Fort Worth. Memorial service is 3 p.m. Saturday, May 6, at Coker Funeral Home in Jacksboro with the Rev. Larry Shields officiating.
