James Harvey "Jim" Jenkins, 89, of Boyd, passed peacefully into Jesus' loving arms Tuesday, June 18, 2019.

Visitation and services were Friday, June 21 at Living Word Lutheran Church in Grapevine and interment followed at Greenwood Mausoleum in Fort Worth.

He was born in Bristow, Okla., to Cleve and Flora Plunkett Jenkins who preceded him in death. Also preceding him in death were his brothers Cleve Jr., Dale and Fred.

Jim was a man of many talents and interests. After his service in the Korean War, he trained as a diesel and exotic car mechanic on the GI bill. He and his wife Hertha, owned several businesses, including the locally famous Beef Burger in Fort Worth. He also worked as a truck
